Results of the 2026 Larimer County Assembly – Resolutions

Ballot Summary:

- Total valid ballots counted: 228
- Unvoted (blank) ballots: 44
- 7 ballots contained more than 10 selections; in accordance with the rules, only the first 10 selections were counted

Adoption Criteria:

Per the adopted rules, the top 10 resolutions receiving the highest number of votes and exceeding 50% of members present and voting are adopted.

RESOLUTIONS ADOPTED

RESOLUTION 1 SUPPORTING REPUBLICAN CONTROL OF PRIMARIES

WHEREAS, the Republican Party is a political organization formed to promote limited government and elect candidates who support those principles, and Colorado law currently requires the Party to allow participation by unaffiliated voters in Republican primary elections;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Republican Party urges the Colorado Republican Party to exercise its statutory option to opt out of the open primary system and pursue appropriate legal remedies to restore party control over its nomination process.

RESOLUTION 2 SUPPORTING PAPER BALLOTS AND PRECINCT VOTING

WHEREAS, public confidence in elections depends on transparent and verifiable processes, and historically elections in the United States and Colorado were conducted using paper ballots cast in person at local precincts and counted with public observation;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Republican Party supports the use of paper ballots counted by hand with appropriate oversight and encourages the restoration of primarily single-day, in-person precinct voting, with reasonable exceptions for military service members, illness, or necessary travel.

RESOLUTION 3 MEDICAL FREEDOM

WHEREAS, the principles of individual liberty, bodily autonomy, and religious freedom recognized in the United States Constitution and the Colorado Republican Party platform affirm the right of individuals and parents to make personal medical decisions—including whether to accept vaccines, medical treatments, or protective measures—without government or institutional coercion;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that this body supports protecting the right of every Coloradan to make voluntary medical decisions and opposes mandates, discrimination, or loss of rights including employment, education, or commercial activity based on an individual's medical or religious choices.

RESOLUTION 4 AFFIRMING CONSTITUTIONAL SUPREMACY IN AMERICAN COURTS

WHEREAS, the United States Constitution and the Constitution of the State of Colorado are the supreme law of the land and guarantee equal protection, due process, and individual liberties, and no foreign or religious legal code should be applied in a manner that conflicts with those constitutional protections;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Republican Party supports ensuring that civil and criminal matters within the United States and the State of Colorado are governed exclusively by the Constitution and duly enacted federal and state law, and that no court or tribunal apply foreign law where it would diminish constitutional rights.

RESOLUTION 5 SUPPORTING ELECTION INTEGRITY AND THE SAVE ACT

WHEREAS, secure elections depend on clear procedures verifying voter eligibility and maintaining public confidence, including voter identification safeguards and ensuring that only United States citizens are permitted to vote in federal elections;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Republican Party supports election integrity measures such as voter identification requirements and urges Congress to pass the Safeguard American Voter Eligibility (SAVE) Act to strengthen verification of citizenship in federal elections.

RESOLUTION 6 SUPPORTING COOPERATION WITH FEDERAL IMMIGRATION ENFORCEMENT

WHEREAS, the rule of law requires that federal immigration laws be enforced and that cooperation among federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies strengthens public safety and the effective administration of justice;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Republican Party supports the lawful mission of U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) and encourages state and local law enforcement agencies to cooperate with federal immigration authorities in accordance with federal and state law to promote public safety and uphold the integrity of the nation's immigration system.

RESOLUTION 7 SUPPORTING INITIATIVE 108 TO PROTECT CHILDREN

WHEREAS, protecting children from sexual exploitation and human trafficking is a fundamental responsibility of government, and Initiative 108 would establish a mandatory life sentence for individuals convicted of buying or selling a child for sex in Colorado;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Republican Party supports Initiative 108 and efforts to strengthen penalties for those who sexually exploit children and reaffirms as unwavering commitment to defending the safety, dignity, and future of every child.

RESOLUTION 8 SUPPORTING INITIATIVE 109 TO PROTECT GIRLS' SPORTS AND PRIVACY

WHEREAS, sex-separated athletics and private facilities have long been recognized as necessary to ensure fairness, safety, and privacy for girls and young women, and Initiative 109 seeks to preserve girls' sports competitions and designated female spaces for biological females in the State of Colorado;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Republican Party expresses its support for Initiative 109 and efforts to protect fairness in girls' athletics and maintain privacy and safety in female-designated spaces.

RESOLUTION 9 SUPPORTING INITIATIVE 110 TO PROTECT MINORS FROM IRREVERSIBLE MEDICAL PROCEDURES

WHEREAS, the State of Colorado has a compelling interest in protecting the health and well-being of minors, and Initiative 110 seeks to prohibit sex change surgeries on individuals under the age of eighteen in order to prevent irreversible medical procedures with significant long-term consequences;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Republican Party expresses its support for Initiative 110 and policies that protect minors from irreversible medical interventions until they reach adulthood.
